Public Comment – Items on the Agenda

Mr. and Mrs. Jiles – 108 E. 12th Avenue – property next door: who’s the owner and what the owners is going to do; want it to be torn down; 112 E. 12th multi-unit needs torn down; she wants the property owner; East Oak Way; complained about the tax collector not being in office.

Mrs. Kay Stewart – spoke about her life changing after the Giant Eagle Pharmacy incident with the Chief; she spoke about how the incident impacted her family and how it could have been a very different, dangerous situation; she talked about her 5 year old who loved police officers but now is traumatized by them and think all officers are bad; Not sure why officer decided to flash his lights and call for back-up, when the police car pulled in front of her, she was not sure what to do; she has not been able to sleep; officer did not think it through during a time when we are trying to build relationships with each other nor was the Chief’s attitude becoming of an officer; she would like to see officers to have their mental state reviewed at various times, a code of conduct for the officers and a community outreach program between the officers and the community.

- A resident asked her what this was about after she was done speaking and she detailed the 8/12/2021 incident that happened while she was waiting in the Giant Eagle Pharmacy drive thru involving Homestead Borough’s Police Chief, Jeffrey Desimone.
- Mr. Borcik stated, “35 minutes”, “35 minutes”

Andre Ellis – 235 E. 8th Avenue – spoke about the Chief and his attitude toward community members. Mr. Ellis was asked to not speak any further about this and they were moving on.

Mr. Stewart – husband of K. Stewart – he stated that if he had been at the incident, he probably would not be standing there; the officer turning on his lights was a way to intimidate, and we do not need this type of behavior; it should be investigated and looked at very deeply to help move community forward; he is worried about stress on an unborn child.

Public Comment – Continued - General Information NOT on the Agenda

Connie Portis – has been coming to meetings for last four years and have sent suggestions to the previous Borough Manager and the current one on communicating to the residents regarding the public meetings; tax payers should know how their tax dollars are being spent; the robocall should be used to remind people on the meeting dates; Borough not reaching out to residents; comment on Mrs. Stewart’s incident, it is dangerous for the Borough not to put out a statement regarding it.

- The Solicitor stated that it was under his legal guidance that Council did not release a statement.
- Ms. Nesby responded that she too has been to many meetings and people don’t come out, and we cannot force their hands to do so. Ms. Nesby and Mr. Borcik said they agree with the use of the Robocall. Mr. Dais responded that robocalls do go out, but only to those that choose to give the Borough office’s their telephone numbers. The Mayor stated that people are not interested in coming to meetings.

Andre Ellis – has heard and seen the Chief cuss people out; should get something harsher than 3 days without pay, that’s a vacation; someone with that kind of power should know how to use it.

- Ms. Nesby told Mr. Ellis that there are policy and procedures that must be followed and does not allow for comments by the Borough or Council; Mr. Borcik stated that there were extenuating circumstances that the public does not know.

Duane Schulte – stated that children are throwing bricks at house on McClure and to please let the police department know to possible increase the patrols up there.

- Mr. Borcik state that there are enough cops now and Mr. Cunningham said to please let the residents know to call 911 anytime this happens.

Ms. Parns informed the residents that there is information on what is happening in the Borough in many places. There is information on the table in front of Council Chambers to sign-up for the robocalls and the e-newsletter. Information is posted on Facebook, the Homestead Borough website, and on the electronic board in front of the Borough Building. She always asks residents that come into the Building if they would like to be added to the robocall.
